Last year, ATEC's School Community Council (SCC) used LAND Trust Funds to increase life, employment, and reading skills by purchasing books and computers for our media center, life centered education curriculum, sensory room equipment, and a tablet for video modeling.

Daily instruction and the life centered curriculum helped to increase student skills and the sensory room equipment has helped to reduce aggressive behaviors for some students with sensory needs.

Since the end of December last year, to the beginning of this school year, the library supplies and books increased student book check out's from zero to more than fifty-two.
