### PGHS DEFEATS LONE PEAK FOR THE TITLE!!

NATED this year's UHSAA State Volleyball Tournament at the UVU McKay Center as they literally "swept" through the tournament,(12-0) NOT losing a single game in four matches to capture the State Championship Title!

Pleasant Grove entered the tournament as the second seed from Region IV. Rival Lone Peak went in as the first seed after sweeping PG 3-0 in Region play. After their third loss to Lone Peak, our team decided that it wasn't going to happen at state! With an incredible work ethic and the necessary adjustments practice, the Vikings were fully prepared for the tournament. The first round defeat of Brighton 3-0 (25-16, 25-21, 25-6) led to a quarterfinal win

The Vikings had split with them previously during pre-season and were excited for another rematch. Once again, they played outstanding volleyball by sweeping #1 ranked Davis 3-0



too! (25-20,25-19,25-21). Going into the state championship match, the Vikings were ready for the Lone Peak rematch. With a fiery sense of confidence and energy visibly noticeable, the Vikings stunned Lone Peak 3-0 as well (25-16, 25-14, 25-19). The Vikings ended with a team total effort of 27 aces. 146 kills. 34 blocks. 132 assists, and 179 digs in their perfect finish at the state tournament. or the first time in a decade PGHS is renewing a legend. Students are joining the Viking Mathletes - a math club sponsored by IM Flash. Every high school in Alpine School District has been given the opportunity to create a math

club. Money from sponsors will go toward incentives for students to tutor and participate in competitions, and to pay teachers/students to run math tutoring labs before and after school. The main focus of the club is to promote progress of students towards advanced mathematics and also to develop stronger tutoring programs. As of the end of first term, the club had over 100 students signed up to participate. Throughout the year the club will listen to guest speakers and take tours of local businesses and organizations to show students how math is used in our community. The club will also attend 5 district level math competitions this year with the option of attending at least one at the state level as well. The PGHS Math Club placed 3<sup>rd</sup> in the first Alpine District Math Competition (Individual All-Around) in September, and plans on dominating the next Team Scramble Competition on November 8th at American Fork High School.
