

GETTING STARTED AT UVU CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT // FALL 2013

6 steps to help you transition from Concurrent Enrollment to a UVU Freshman

1 RE-APPLY TO UVU - All CE Students Need To Re-Apply For Admissions.

Apply as a RETURNING/READMIT STUDENT at www.uvu.edu/admissions. You will then receive an email confirming your application to UVU and reminding you of your UV ID number. To complete the application process, submit the following if you haven't already:

a. Official transcripts: All transcripts must arrive at UVU in an unopened envelope from the sending institution and must be printed within the last six months to be considered official. Items must be postmarked before the admissions deadline.

b. Official ACT or SAT scores: Current ACT or SAT test scores are required for all students under age 20, and either ACT/SAT or Accuplacer is required for all students regardless of age. Send official test scores to the Admissions Office. If the ACT or SAT have not been completed or are expired (two years for math and three years for English), placement testing (ACT-R, Accuplacer) is required and can be taken at Testing Services in the Wolverine Service Center. ACT-R testing is offered on a weekly basis by appointment; Accuplacer testing is given daily on a walk-in basis. More information and hours are available at www.uvu.edu/testingservices. All testing must be complete before the admissions deadline.

Once all required documentation is received by UVU, you will receive an acceptance letter to the email address you provide.

The admissions deadline is August 1 for fall semester and December 1 for spring semester.

2 MEET WITH YOUR NEW ACADEMIC ADVISOR

After completing the above steps, meet with your new major advisor to get personalized help and be cleared for registration. To locate your advisor, go to www.uvu.edu and click on "Find Your Advisor" or visit www.uvu.edu/advising after February 15th.

3 ATTEND ORIENTATION - Orientation Is Mandatory For All Students.

To register for orientation, visit www.uvu.edu/orientation. Attending orientation events are designed to make your transition to university life a success and to introduce you to the many services, programs and resources available at UVU.

4 REGISTER FOR CLASSES

Log on to UVlink, go to the "Student" tab and choose "Planning Your Education," under "Registration Tools for Students," then select "Look Up Classes." For questions regarding registration call One Stop at (801) 863-4636. Fall registration opens early April. Spring registration opens in early November.

5 PAY TUITION

To access UVU's online payment services, log on to UVlink and locate "Financing & Paying for Your Education" under the "Student" tab. Important payment deadlines and purge dates can be found on the student timetable located at www.uvu.edu/schedule.

6 FINANCIAL AID & SCHOLARSHIPS

Apply for scholarships as a Freshman at www.uvu.edu/fincanciaid/scholarships. **DEADLINE: FEBRUARY 1ST.** To apply for federal and state aid, follow these steps: (1) Obtain a PIN at www.pin.ed.gov (2) Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at www.fafsa.gov (3) Check UVlink for your financial aid status and to read important email notices. OTHER IMPORTANT INFORMATION:

Textbooks: You can purchase textbooks online through UVlink. Locate "Student Services & Resources" under the "Student" tab then "Book Match," or visit the UVU Bookstore in the Sorensen Student Center.

ID Card: After you have registered, get a UVOneCard/UVPlusCard at Campus Connection, located in the Sorensen Student Center. Your UVOneCard gives you access to the UVU library, athletic events, student activities, computer labs and a 5 percent discount at UVU Dining Services. You can also activate your UTA Bus Pass at Campus Connection.

Parking Permits: Permits are required to park on campus and can be obtained online through UVlink under the "Student" tab on the "Getting Started" menu or by visiting One Stop or Parking Services. To learn more about parking on campus, visit www.uvu.edu/parking.
