FORMER Concurrent Enrollment Student





The admission deadlines are August 1 for fall semester and December 1 for spring semester. To submit the online application, visit uvu.edu/admissions and complete a former, returning concurrent enrollment application. Along with the application, you must submit the following:

A. Official transcripts:

- 1. High school transcripts will be considered official if they arrive at UVU from the high school in an official unopened envelope, emailed (admissions@uvu.edu) directly to UVU from the high school, or faxed (801-863-8913) to UVU directly from the high school.
- 2. College transcripts will be considered official if they have been issued within the last six months and arrive at UVU from the college/university in an official sealed envelope or sent electronically from the college/university to etranscriptr@uvu.edu using a secure transcript exchange company or certified PDF document.
- B. Official ACT/SAT or Accuplacer scores: Current ACT/SAT scores are required for all students under the age of 20; all students 20 or older are required to take the Accuplacer placement test (unless previous college math and English courses have been transferred to UVU). If the ACT or SAT have not been completed or are expired (two years for math and three years for English), placement testing (ACT-R or Accuplacer) is required and can be taken at Testing Services in the Wolverine Service Center. Information, exam costs, and hours are available at uvu.edu/testingservices. All testing must be completed before the admission deadline.

Once your application and all required documentation are reviewed by UVU, an acceptance email, including your UV ID number, will be sent to the email address you provided on your application. ADVISING & ORIENTATION

Before registering for classes, you will be required to meet with your adviser and participate in orientation. Classes fill up quickly so plan to fulfill your advising and orientation requirements as soon as possible.

- A. Advising After completing the above steps, meet with your adviser to get personalized help and for final clearance to register for your classes. To locate your adviser, visit uvu.edu/advising.
- B. Orientation All students must complete orientation before registering for classes. You will find instructions on how to meet your orientation requirement at uvu.edu/orientation.

REGISTER FOR CLASSES

After your adviser has removed your registration hold and you have fulfilled the mandatory orientation requirement, log on to UVLink, go to the "Student" tab, and select "Planning Your Education." Inside the "Registration Tools for Students" section, select "Look Up Classes." For questions regarding registration, call One Stop at 801-863-4636. Fall registration opens in early April; spring registration opens in early November.

PAY TUITION

More information on tuition deadlines can be found on the Student Timetable located at uvu.edu/schedule. Students must have tuition paid, financial aid awarded, or be enrolled in a UVU Tuition Payment Plan to prevent their class schedule from being dropped for nonpayment. To access UVU's online payment services, log on to UVLink and under the "Student" tab locate "Financing & Paying for Your Education."



SCHOLARSHIPS & FINANCIAL AID:

The deadline for scholarship applications is Febuary 1. Apply for scholarships at uvu.edu/financialaid/scholarships. You can contact scholarships at 801-863-8443.

To apply for federal and state aid, follow these steps:

- Complete the free application for federal student aid (FAFSA) at fafsa.gov.
- Check UVLink for your financial aid status and to read important email notices. You can contact financial aid at 801-863-8442.

TEXTBOOKS:

You can purchase textbooks online through UVLink. Locate "Student Services & Resources" under the "Student" tab, then "Book Search." Or visit the UVU Bookstore in the Sorensen Student Center.

ID CARD:

After registering for a class, get a UV OneCard/UV PlusCard at campus connection in the Sorensen StudentCenter. Your UV OneCard gives you access to the UVU Library, athletic events, student activities, and computer labs, as well as a 5-percent discount at UVU dining services if you open a UVU Greenbucks account for on-campus purchases. You can also activate your UTA bus pass at Campus Connection.

PARKING PERMITS:

Parking permits are required to park anywhere on UVU's Orem Campus and West Campus. Parking permits are available from the Parking Office at 936 S. 400 West or online at uvu.edu/parking. The Parking Office website also provides parking maps, parking regulations, and other information to assist you in parking on campus. You can also contact the Parking Office at 801-863-8188 Monday through Friday, 7 a.m.-5 p.m.

HOUSING:

Student housing information is available at uvu.edu/housing. UVU does not own or manage any housing or dormitory options on or off campus. The department works with local landlords to provide accurate housing information so students can choose the most suitable housing while attending UVU. DEFERRED ADMISSION:

Deferred admission was created for students who need to delay their admission to a future semester for a humanitarian or religious mission, military service, or health, financial, and/or family responsibilities. To defer your admission to a future semester, complete the following steps. For questions, email deferredadmission@uvu.edu.

- 1. Visit uvu.edu/admissions/deferred to complete the application.
- 2. Complete the Student Information Release Authorization form to designate someone to register you for classes.
- 3. If you have been awarded a scholarship, accept the scholarship through UVLink.
- Complete the Request to Hold Scholarship Award form to hold your scholarship until you return.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE:
