

Did you know?

State Championships - MVHS Boys and Girls Cross Country swept the State Championships in 2011 for their 19th and 15th titles. In 31 years, MVHS has over 85 state athletic championships. This record is unequalled by any other High School in the state.

Associate's Degrees & Concurrent Enrollment - Last year 14 students from our graduating class received their college Associate's degree with their High School Diploma by taking advantage of concurrent enrollment and distance education classes. More concurrent enrollment credit was given per student at MVHS than any other Alpine High School with over 3600 college credits earned.

New Facilities - We recently completed construction on a new Auxiliary Gym, a new Acrylic track, and a new Bruin Bowl press box.

MVHS Performing Arts - Our choir, music, drama, and dance programs are considered among the top in the state. Our choir is among the largest and most decorated in the West. Around 20% of our students take advantage of this great program. Our drama department consistently wins high honors and undertakes the most ambitious performance schedule in the district. Our music programs consistently earn superior ratings in festivals. We also offer both modern and ballroom instruction, from beginning classes to expert teams, with our Orchestral Dance Company and Ballroom Team.

Advanced Degrees - Over 40% of our faculty hold Master's or Doctoral Degrees, making our staff very qualified for advanced learning.

Flex Time - Mountain View adopted a Flex Time intervention system this school year to improve passing rates and grades. The number of students who failed a course in term 1 dropped 30% from last year.

Latinos in Action - Our Latino in Action program has become the model around Utah and the West. Over 58 secondary schools in Utah, Idaho, and Washington have modeled LIA programs based on Mountain View. Over 50 of our students travel daily to neighborhood schools to tutor students in literacy.

MVHS is restructuring our curriculum teams from department level to individual course level to provide more focus on curriculum and assessment.

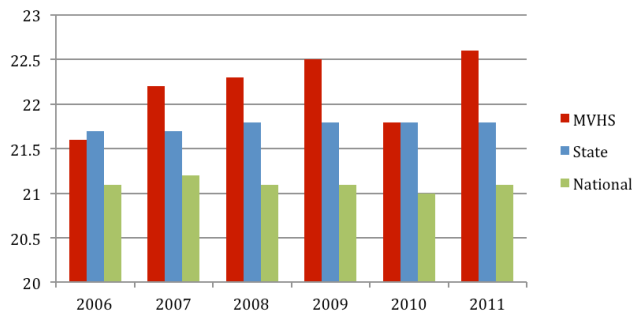

The federal government publishes a report card based on standardized testing performance. Based on this report MVHS was judged to have met adequate yearly progress.

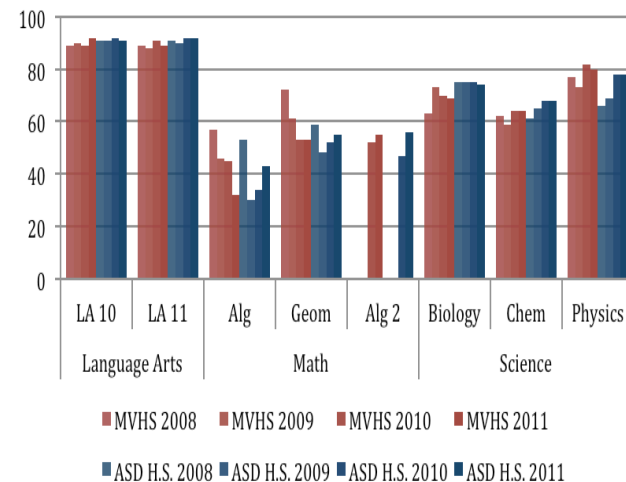
ACT

Almost all of our college-bound students take the ACT in preparation for applying for admissions and scholarships to colleges and universities. Below is a graph comparing our composite ACT scores.



Course Outcomes

In the majority of courses, students are assessed by teachers using their own measurements. The State of Utah provides end-of-course tests for nine courses given at Mountain View. Our data for these courses is shown below in comparison to the other high schools in Alpine District.



3. How do we respond to students who are not learning?

Each curriculum team makes decisions on how to structure intervention. The following programs are resources for our students:

Flex Time - We have a 25-minute block Tuesday through Friday for Flex Time. Students who are doing well in all classes have the freedom to work independently or have free time. Students who are struggling are required to work with their teachers to improve their grades.

Interventions - In addition to Flex Time, we have a number of interventions that help students who are not learning the required standards. They include:

- * Assigned Student Advocates
- * Study Skills Classes
- * Counseling Groups
- * Mediation and Strengthening Families evening family classes

Extended School Year - MVHS is one of two Alpine High Schools to offer a full schedule of classes in the summer for both credit recovery and credit acceleration. Over 1130 quarter credits were earned last summer by over 500 students.

4. How do we respond to students who already know?

Advanced Courses - MVHS offers advanced classes in every discipline including 19 different concurrent enrollment courses, 17 AP courses, and a selection of distance education courses. Mountain View is consistently among the state leaders in tests passed as well as concurrent enrollment credit earned.
