Empower all students to become life-long learners and contribute to society.

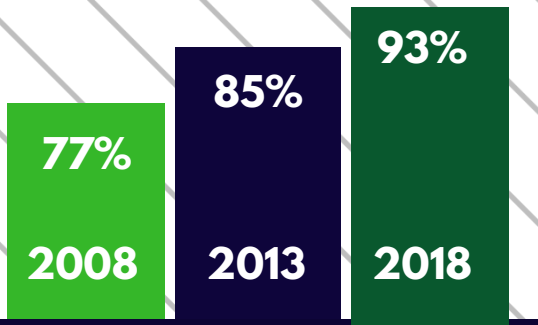

Teacher Support For Students



We care deeply about our students success individually and collectively.

Our commitment to our students is that they will be prepared to go on to college, the military or certify in a program for a specific job in the workplace. We expect every student attending THS to prepare and plan for some kind of after high school training/education program and we are committed to helping every student succeed for these opportunities.



What is the difference between Consultation Time and SET Time?

Two major supports that are built into the school day help students when they haven't mastered content essentials. They are called SET Time (Second Effort Time) and Consultation Time.

While they are both valuable for students, the purposes and format are quite different.

Consultation Time: Monday for 20 Minutes—Student Directed

It is on Monday after 2nd period. This is a short time where students who have been absent, need to make up a quiz, or turn in an assignment can touch base with their teacher. Students can also go and receive help when needed. They can see more than one teacher if needed.

SET Time: Tues/Wed for the last 20 Minutes of each period—Teacher Directed

When students haven't mastered essential knowledge or skills, a teacher can keep the students that need a little more time and support to learn the skills and knowledge needed and release students who don't need extra support during the last 20 minutes of each period on Tues/Wed.

TOP 5 ways to use Consultation Time on Mondays

Check in with teacher about something you've missed or need help with.

Take a quiz or short test.

Go somewhere like the library to study or do homework

Meet with a teacher/advisor of a sport/club.

If your grades are completely fine, enjoy socializing with your friends.

Testing Center

SCHOOL LAND TRUST PROGRAM



Timpanogos High School (THS) receives funding from the School LAND Trust Program. To qualify for this funding THS is required to have a School Community Council (SCC) consisting of the principal, elected parents and school employees. The main duty of the SCC is to develop our school improvement plan and determine how to spend our annual School LAND Trust funds.

THS received approximately \$150,706 in School LAND Trust funds for the 2018-19 school year. The money has been allocated to provide resources for teacher development in the form of summer collaboration, ongoing professional development and purchasing equipment and software for classroom instruction. It has also been a significant support for students for things such as after school Math Lab, ACT Test Prep, and the East Shore Center.

THS SCC meetings are held monthly on the second Tuesday at 2:30 pm in the main office. Any patron is welcome to come. Only elected members have the ability to vote on motions in the SCC meetings. If you are interested in becoming a voting member of SCC please contact principal Dr. Joe Jensen. Positions are elected in the spring.
