THE SCHOOL AND THE COMMUNITY

Timpanogos is in Orem City, a technologically progressive community with a population of 100,089. Orem is located 45 miles south of Salt Lake City and just minutes away from Utah Valley University and Brigham Young University. Timpanogos is part of Alpine School District which serves the communities of Orem, Pleasant Grove, Lindon, American Fork, Highland, Lehi, Alpine, Cedar Fort, Eagle Mountain, and Saratoga Springs. The district office is located at 575 North 100 East, American Fork, Utah, 84003.

The school operates on a quarter system with 184 days of classroom instruction per year. Students may select from more than 225 course offerings, for 8 courses (double block schedule) each semester. Many of the classes include 10th, 11th, and 12th grade students enrolled in the same course. There are 85 certified faculty members with four full-time counselors, three assistant principals, and one principal. Twenty-four percent of the staff have earned Master's degrees or higher.

THE ACADEMIC PROGRAM

THS offers a comprehensive program with both college and vocational post-secondary preparation. Timpanogos prides itself on reducing barriers to rigorous course selection and strives to provide equitable opportunities for all students. Several of our classes integrate vocational and academic materials. Students are encouraged to explore career pathways and opportunities in their course selection to help prepare them for entry level employment or continued education. We currently offer over 25 courses that have concurrent college credit available and 22 Advanced Placement (AP) courses. We also offer 18 college courses available through Utah Valley University's Live Interactive program.

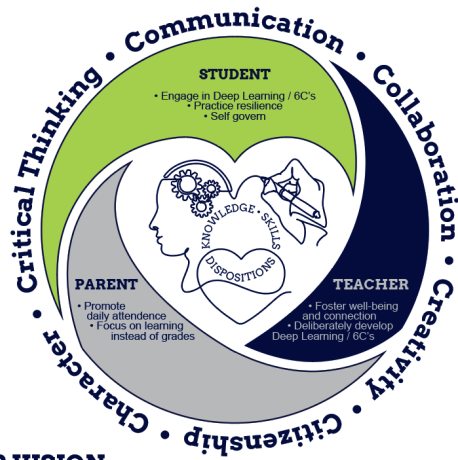
