



Lynne Benham welcomed the group to the September meeting. The minutes from the August meeting were read and approved.

Mr Twitchell updated the council on the following

- Our graduation rate for May 2017 was 94.22%, which is the highest grad rate since the school opening, second highest in Alpine School District. Mr. Twitchell gave kudos to his administration team, the counselors and teachers.
- We have the most students completing concurrent enrollment than any other high school in ASD and our AP results are increasing. AP and concurrent enrollment increased by 167% from the 2014-15 school year.
- Our PLC teams play a huge part as well as teachers working so hard to make this success happen.





Over Crowding

- Currently, we have approximately 3250 students. Our projected number was 3000 for the 2017-18 school year.
- Alpine School District has helped immensely with the growth in the following ways:
 - o Added 4 FTE above the original allotment. They were used for:
 - Added 2 sections of Earth Science
 - Added ½ time art teacher
 - Added 2 sections of Language Arts (English 10 & 11)
 - Added 2 sections of Secondary Math
 - Added 1 section of Spanish 1
 - Added 1 full-time language arts teacher
 - Added 1 full-time teacher in elective sciences & psychology
 - Added an assistant registrar who is hired and being trained
 - Added 40 tables and 80 chairs for 2 classrooms—that has allowed us to covert 2 rooms into classroom
 - Added a mobile computer lab (40 machines, cart and charger)
 - Added 2 serving carts and personnel to assist with splitting lunch lines
 - Chick-Fil-A and Costa Vida are here serving lunch out of the football concessions. They also included 8 lunch tables.
 - A large tent for the area west of the lunchroom. This will expand the seating area at lunch. It will also come with heaters to be able to utilize it during the winter months.

Trustlands Amendment

- We are starting a positive intervention program called Nobilis. The administration is seeking \$10,000 to help with this program.
- We will be able to meet all of the needs of the original proposal and be able to fund the \$10,000 for the Nobilis program.
- The amendment was motioned, voted and approved.

Other items

- Sophomores will take the practice ACT test on October 9th, which is the same day as College Day.
- Rhonda Bromley will attend our next SCC meeting. She will review the timeline of the new Eagle Mountain High School.
